- › Broken glass

- › Glass jars from e.g. pesto, instant coffee and jam

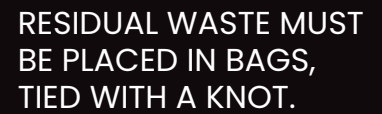

- › Cans
- › Foil trays
- › Drink cans (without deposit)
- › Tea light holders
- › Capsules and lids
- › Tin foil
- › Coffee capsules (without coffee)
- › Cutlery
- › Pots and pans



- › Dirty paper and cardboard packaging
- › Wrapping paper and ribbon
- › Sanitary products
- › Cigarette butts
- › Baking paper
- › Wet paper and cardboard
- › Cotton buds
- › Melamine e.g. a melamine bowl or a children's cup
- › Coffee capsules (*containing coffee*)

- › Too old food
- › Small bones e.g. from poultry and pork
- › Fish and shellfish
- › Flower bouquets
- › Rice and pasta
- › Cheese and dairy products
- › Fruit and vegetables
- › Coffee filters and tea bags
- › Meat and leftover cold cuts
- › Sauces and fats

- › Cardboard trays
- › Egg boxes
- › Cardboard boxes from cereals and oats
- › Corrugated cardboard
- › Cardboard packaging
- › Shoe boxes

FOR DRY TEXTILE WASTE.



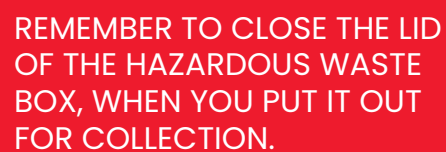
Yes please:

WORN-OUT CLOTHES:

- › Blouses, tops and T-shirts
- › Shirts and jumpers
- › Trousers, shorts and skirts
- › Underwear
- › Socks, stockings and tights
- › Sportswear and swimwear
- › Cloth nappies (*clean*)
- › Hats, gloves and scarves
- › Pieces of clothing

WORN-OUT TEXTILES:

- › Tea towels and dishcloths
- › Tablecloths and fabric napkins
- › Bed linen
- › Tote bags (*textile only*)
- › Towels
- › Cushion and pillow covers
- › Blankets
- › Fabric scraps



- › Paint residue
- › Aerosol cans
- › Batteries
- › Nail polish and nail polish remover
- › Chemicals
(preferably in original packaging)
- › Thermometers
- › Light sources e.g. light bulbs and LED bulbs
- › Oil residues
- › Household pesticides
- › Printer cartridges
- › Pest control poison
- › Empty packaging with one of the hazard symbols 'Acute toxicity' or 'Health hazard'
